



## FEDERAL GOVERNMENT PRODUCT STEWARDSHIP BATTERY: ACCREDITATION ANNOUNCEMENT

On Friday at Parliament House in Canberra, Assistant Minister for Waste Reduction and Environmental Management, Hon Trevor Evans MP, announced the Federal Government's Battery Stewardship Scheme accreditation scheme recipients.
